Question No.197 – Disaster Management Recovery Plan by the Government and Solomon Airlines

Hon. Matthew Wale, MP for Aoke/Langalanga to ask the Minister for Communication and Aviation:

- a) Can the Minister confirm that the Government and Solomon Airlines has in place a Disaster Management Recovery Plan to be approved prior to international operations into Munda, and if so, how many hospital beds per aircraft seat capacity is planned?
- b) Also has this plan been exercised either on site in Munda or via desktop in Honiara by both the state (SIG) and the operator (Solomon Airlines) as required by the Civil Aviation Act and Regulations?

 - c) the number of hectares of such total area that is improved and the total area of the land that is swampy or flood prone?
 - d) the public purpose for which the land is being purchased?
 - e) who signed the purchase agreement on behalf of the government and the date of that agreement?
 - f) the total value to be paid under the agreement?
 - g) the value of any deposits already paid and the dates of payments?
 - h) does the agreement allow the government any exit clauses if it wishes not to proceed to purchase the land?

 - (c) in subsection (5), by deleting “2 women are to be members of the Commission” and substituting “one member of the Commission must be a woman”.
2. New section 57A, which is inserted by clause 6, is amended as follows:
 - (a) In the section heading, by deleting “Commissioner of Elections” and substituting “Chief Electoral Officer”;
 - (b) In subsection (1), by deleting “Commissioner of Elections” and substituting “Chief Electoral Officer”;
 - (c) In subsections (2), (3) and (4), by deleting “Commissioner” and substituting “Chief Electoral Officer”.
3. Clauses 7 and 8 are amended by deleting each reference to “Commissioner of Elections” and substituting “Chief Electoral Officer”.

Hon. Ishmael Mali Avui, Minister for Home Affairs to move the following amendment:

That the *Electoral Bill 2018* be amended as follows:

- (a) Clause 2 is deleted and replaced with the following:

“2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date or different dates appointed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.”

Hon. Rick Houenipwela, Prime Minister to move the following amendment:

That the *Constitution (Amendment) (Electoral Reform) Bill 2018* be amended as follows:

- (a) Clause 1(2) is deleted and replaced with the following:

“(2) This Act commences on the date or different dates appointed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.

Hon. Derick Manu’ari, Minister for Justice and Legal Affairs to move the following amendments:

That the *Legal Profession Bill 2017* be amended as follows:

- a) Clause 206(2) is amended by deleting “2019” and substituting “2020”.

- (b) clause 5, definition of **“supervised legal practice”**, paragraph (b), delete “subparagraph (i)” and substitute “paragraph (a)”;
- (c) clause 67(1)(f), insert “the” before “Authority”;
- (d) clause 82(3), delete “subsection(1)” and substitute “subsection (2)”;
- (e) clause 82(4), delete “a ceasing” and substitute “ceasing”;
- (f) clause 99(1)(a)(ii), delete “be” and substitute “been”;
- (g) clause 137(b), delete “; or” and substitute “.”.

The Objects and Reasons immediately following the end of the *Legal Profession Bill 2017* are amended by replacing the name of the former Minister for Justice and Legal Affairs, Hon. William Bradford Marau, with the name of the new Minister for Justice and Legal Affairs, Hon. Derick Manu’ari.
